



## Justin bieber ready to return and go on 'Justice World Tour': After 'Ramsay Hunt Syndrome Diagnosis'

The Canadian singer was diagnosed with 'Ramsay Hunt Syndrome', he revealed this news on Tuesday, Jul 18, 2022, on an Instagram video. Bieber had already been seeking treatment for his Lyme disease for many years. He later had to cancel his North American tour dates that were scheduled this June.

He addressed the issue as some of his fans may be frustrated because of the show cancellations and also told, "I'm just physically not capable of doing them." Bieber also added, "This is pretty serious, as you can see. I wish this wasn't the case. But obviously, my body is telling me I need to slow down."

He also explained further about his illness and how it has affected his physical wellbeing, he said the virus attacked the nerve in his ears and face which has caused paralysis and showed that he is unable to make any movement on one side of his face. "As you can see this eye is not blinking. I can't smile on this side of my face. This nostril will not move."

It has been revealed that Bieber has been taking treatments with top specialists, doing facial exercises and also taking enough rest and relaxing as much as possible, and also relying on prayers and his Christianity faith.



*His wife Hailey told that Justin has been faithful and that the situation will be resolved but the couple has been having a tough time. She also added, "The last thing he wanted was to postpone the concerts."*

*Before Bieber revealed his return to resume world tour, Usher revealed that "Justin has been handling his health issues well, he is doing great", he added. He also said it's great to see Justin getting support from his fans and family with whatever he has been experiencing right now.*

*Justin announced on Tuesday, July 18, that he will perform again on July 31 at the Lucca Summer Festival in Italy. Before traveling to South America in September, he will perform at five additional European venues in August. In the upcoming months, Bieber has 75 shows planned, in addition to stops in Asia, Australia, and Africa. Early in 2023, he will return to Europe. North American dates that were postponed should soon be rescheduled for the next year.*
