



## First Kill' Canceled By Netflix After One Season

The supernatural, queer centric show "FirstKill" has been canceled after one batch of its episodes and will not be renewed for a second season. FirstKill, being the latest show of Netflix got canceled after its first season with reports claiming that the decision was made because the show did not meet its viewership requirements. The show is completely based on V.E. Schwab's short story of the same name. The plot revolves around two adolescent girls who fall in love but are separated by their families. The plot of Romeo and Juliet is given a supernatural twist in this story.

*Juliette, being one of the two main characters, is a vampire, and Calliope, her co-star and love interest, comes from a long line of monster hunters. Schwab was also asked to contribute the show's script.*

While the first season received mixed reviews from critics, it was able to build a strong fan and viewer base. The season premiered on June 10th, 2022. The show reached the Top 10 most watched on Netflix within the first three days of its release. By the end of its first full week, it had risen to third place, trailing only Stranger Things and Peaky Blinders. The show then stayed on the top ten for the following week, and then by the end of its run,

it had crossed over 100 million hours watched by the end of its first 28-day cycle. And, despite the fact that the show only debuted two months ago, it has a huge devoted fan base that is devastated now by this cancellation news. Unfortunately for these fans, First Kill is one of the most recent Netflix cancellations.

According to Variety, some of the sources who are close to the situation maintain that Netflix is quite proud of the work that everyone involved has put in their hard work in the first season. These sources then reiterated that the decision was wholly based on viewing numbers versus the cost. Elizabeth Mitchell, Aubin Wise, Jason Robert Moore, Gracie Dzienn, Will Swenson, Phillip Mullings Jr., Dominic Goodman, and Dylan McNamara also appeared in the film.

Henderson, who served as the showrunner, executive produced the show through Belletrist Productions along with creator Schwab, as well as Roberts and Karah Preiss.
