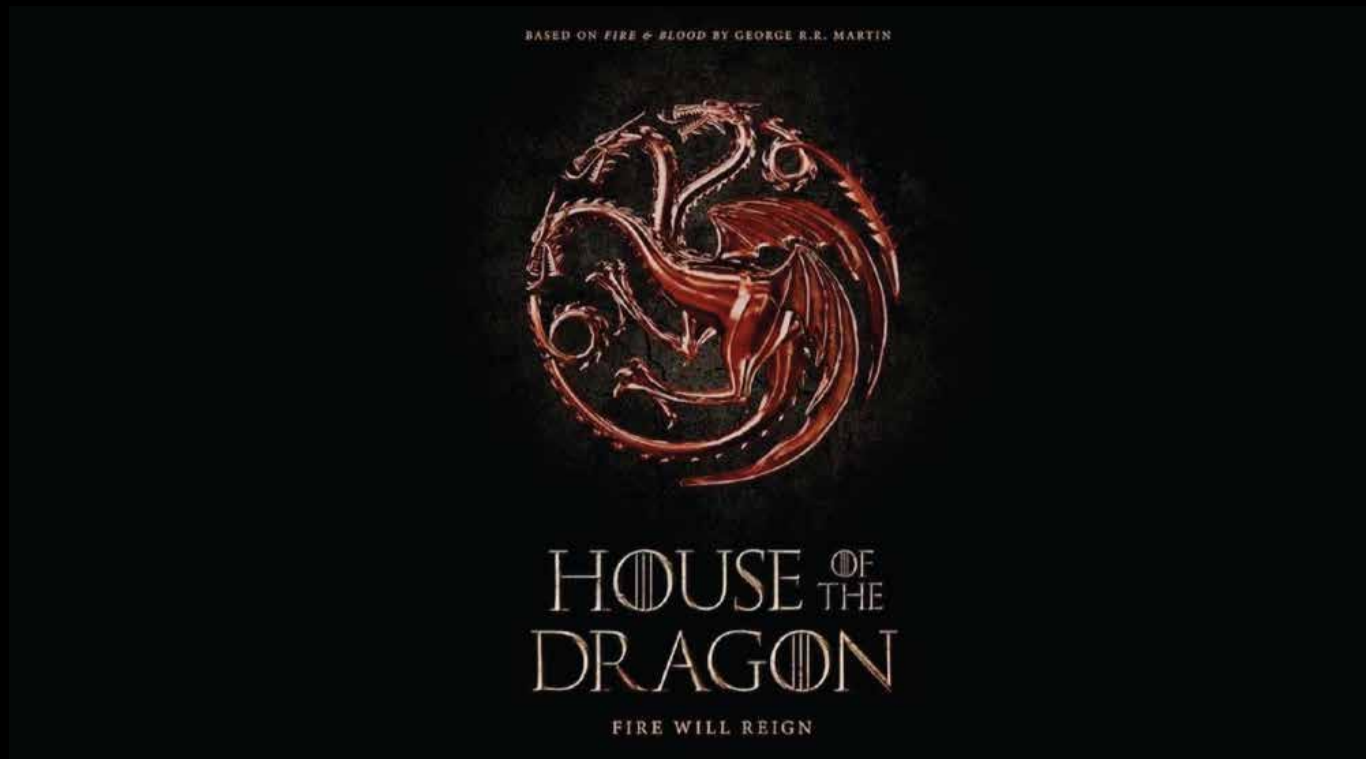


Spin-off series "Game of Thrones" coming on HBO



The spin-off series House of the Dragons, based on the most popular fantasy drama series Game of Thrones, is planned to launch on HBO later this summer, on August 21, 2022. According to the source, a prospective sequel focusing on one of the original series' most known characters, Kit Harington's Jon Snow, is being considered. However, the concept is still in the early stages of development.



The eighth and final season of Game of Thrones aired in 2019, capping off one of the longest runs in the history of the film industry (2011-2019), with 59 Emmy nominations. The series is based on George R.R. Martin's hit fantasy novels.



The conclusion of Game of Thrones in 2019 left many fans dissatisfied with the way the series ended. There was also a demand to have the final season redone, which continued George R.R. Martin and HBO's concentration on Game of Thrones prequels, based on his novel once again.

Paddy Considine, Emma D'Arcy, Steve Toussaint, Matt Smith, Olivia Cooke, and others will star in "House of the Dragon." "Dunk & Egg", "The Sea Snake", and "10,000 Ships" are among the projects in development.



The filming of "House of the Dragon" was officially completed in February 2022, and the editing process is currently underway. "Exciting news out of London — I am informed that shooting for the first season (10-ep) of 'House of the Dragon' has wrapped," Martin said on his blog



Martin also disclosed that three animated "Game of Thrones" projects are in the process, one of which is based on the ancient Chinese The Golden Empire of Yi Ti.

There are many more details to come up with that are still being kept under wraps.
